Conversely, during the 23 years from 1990-2012, there were 1,495 players with a 100-Strikeout season.

The term "walk-off" in referring to a game-ending home run was credited to pitcher **Dennis Eckersley** in 1988, when in an interview he said, "that was a real walk-off piece of **** I just served up" after giving up a game-winning HR in the bottom of the last inning. He referred to walk-off hits or HR after that as "walk-off pieces."

From 1987-1998, **Eckersley** finished 577 games and gave up 7 Walk-off Home Runs, all as a Reliever.

Pitcher **Roy Face** (1953-1969) is the career record-holder with 17 Walk-Off Home Runs allowed (see page 280).

* Prior to 1920, a team couldn't win a game in the bottom of the last inning by more than one run, so some game-ending HR became Singles, 2B or 3B. This rule impacted 44 game-winning HR hit from 1884-1918 that became lesser hits, including one by **Babe Ruth** on 7/8/1918, credited as a Triple (the winning runner scored one base in front of him).
